regional update

In January WHG have been reviewing regional indicators of sexual and reproductive health including participation in pap screening and chlamydia rates. Pap screening rates for 2013 have recently been released showing the Grampians region (58.6%) recorded the second lowest screening rate of Department of Health regions in Victoria. This represents only a slight increase of 1% from 2012.

- 7 of our 11 LGA's have screening rates lower than Victoria
- 3 LGA's ranked in the bottom 10 LGA's within the state

The annual statistical report by the Victorian Cervical Cytology Registry (VCCR) highlights the work of pap test nurses.

During 2013, a total of 38,012 Pap tests were collected across Victoria and reported to the Registry by 437 credentialed nurses. This number represents 6.3% of all Pap tests collected in Victoria during 2013. This figure reflects the significant growth in the role of nurses in cervical screening. The Grampians

region has the lowest number of pap test nurses. However as a group they recorded the 2nd highest percentage of regional tests in the state with 19.1% of all tests collected across Grampians region being by credentialed nurses.

Rates of participation in pap screening is an example of health behaviour, giving us some insight into potentially unmet sexual health needs within our region.

Women's Health Grampians are looking forward to the International Women's Day event we are hosting in partnership with Grampians Pyrenees PCP.

Acclaimed comedian Nelly Thomas will deliver "The Talk" live in Ararat on 11 March at 7PM.

Health Translations: Multilingual sexual health information

The Health Translations Online Directory enables health practitioners and those working with culturally and linguistically diverse communities to easily find translated health information.

The Directory is part of the Victorian Government's broader Language Services Strategy and serves as a web portal providing direct links to translated health resources in Victoria, other states and Federal Government resources.

There are resources available in many languages covering a multitude of health topics.

The Department of Health resource: 'Safe Sex - The best protection against sexually transmissible infections, including HIV/AIDS' is now available to download in 10 languages other than English. This is a great resource covering topics such as;

- What is safe sex?
- How can I practise safe sex?
- What is a sexually transmissible infection (STI)?
- Why use condoms?
- How do I use condoms correctly?
- What other protection is available?
- Where can I get further information or help?

The sexual health of women aged 50 and over: A literature Review

Increased life expectancy for women, coupled with higher rates of separation and divorce, has resulted in many older women becoming single and seeking new sexual partners in the later stages of life.

This is influencing sexual health outcomes for older women. Research suggests that there are a number of contributing factors to an increase in the rate of sexually transmitted infections (STIs) amongst women over the age of 50.

This has prompted discussions around the issue of older women's sexual health as it has not previously been given the same consideration as younger women's sexual health.

In 2012, WHG's sister organisation Women's Health in the South East (WHISE) began to further explore the issue of older women's sexual health.

WHISE have completed a deep exploration into the available literature on the sexual health of women aged 50 and over resulting in an extensive literature review. To access the literature review and see other aspects of WHISE's work in this important area visit their [website](#)



WOMENS HEALTH COURSE

FREE ONLINE TRAINING FOR NURSES

Enhancing Knowledge of Adolescent Fertility

This online learning course offered by the Australian Primary Health Care Nurses Association (APNA) provides primary health care nurses with an overview of adolescent fertility.
