Minyip Murtoa Football Netball club and Horsham Amateur Basketball Association are excited to be working with Women's Health Grampians (WHG) as part of the Act@Play program. Act@Play is a cultural change initiative delivered in the Wimmera Region that helps sporting clubs to challenge violence against women, challenge stereotypes, empower women and girls, build respectful relationships and promote gender equality. Gender inequality is a significant driver of violence against women, and encouraging respectful, equitable relationships at the community level is a vital part of preventing violence before it happens.

Funded through Sport and Recreation Victoria, the program involves developing a leadership group to help drive the program at the club, completing tools such as a baseline survey, gender audit, active by-stander training and then implementing an action plan based on these results.

Women's Health Grampians (WHG) Chief Executive Officer Marianne Hendron said "Women's Health Grampians is pleased to be working closely with Minyip Murtoa Football Netball Club and Horsham Amateur Basketball Association with Act@Play. We know the important role sporting clubs have in rural communities and the influence these settings will have in creating positive change around gender equality and violence against women in the local community".
